Sleaford station building update

Work started on a feasibility study to renovate the old waiting room on the Island Platform into a Educuation and Community Room. The report is now complete and both the drains and water supply are not viable into the room. The project will still be going ahead. Funding has been secured from East Midlands Railway and we are in talks with the Railway Heritage Trust.

Boston panel installation
