The only working Sheriff's watermill in England, watch the mill produce traditional stoneground flour on event days.



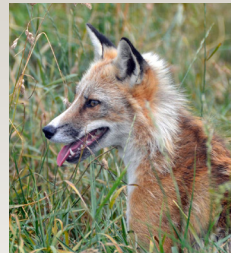
### **BATEMAN'S BREWERY WAINFLEET**

## GRANTHAM



Known for being the birthplace of the first woman Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher and where Sir Isaac Newton made his 'Gravity' discovery. Historic market town next to the River Witham. For heritage days out visit St Botolph's Church - known locally as 'The Stump' and the Guildhall.

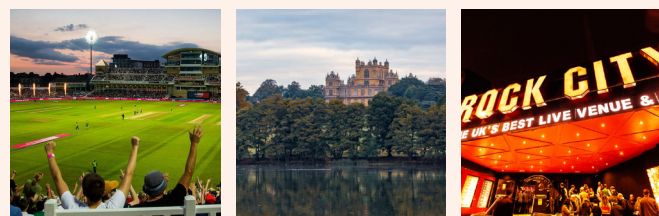
It's just a short stroll to the charming Market Place where you will find independent retailers and eateries along with recognised chain brands.
